Solid’Africa is a local NGO that helps vulnerable patients in public hospitals in Rwanda. Working along with social workers, **our five main programs** aim at compensating the lack of financial resources and thus, ease their recovery and accelerate their return back home.

1. GEMURA - Food for All

Solid’Monday - Lunch every Monday at CHUK - **Target: 300 patients.**
Daily Breakfast - Milk, porridge and bread distributed every day at CHUK and Muhima (Intensive care and Emergency Units) - **Target: 300 patients.**

Follow up and catering for **special diet.**

Gemura Kitchen - Building a public kitchen with a capacity of **feeding more than 1000 people every day** in 4 public hospitals in Kigali.

2. KIZA - Medical Expenses

Payment of medicine for the most socio-economically challenged and for special cases; provision of special care items including crutches and wheelchairs.

3. SUKURA - Hygiene

Provision of clothing items and personal hygienic products (such as soaps, toilet papers, sanitary pads, towels, blankets, etc.)

4. GOMBORA - Hospital Bills Payment and Transport

Payment of outstanding hospital bills, release of held-in cases, repatriation home through payment of transportation fees.

5. MENYA - Advocacy and awareness

Promotion of the Mutuelle scheme, information campaigns on availability of health services, support of citizen’s effort in promoting public health programs, implementation of projects to improve living conditions in public hospitals (e.g. playground for children in CHUK pediatric ward).
